Put a Little Green in Your Life

Put A Little Green in Your Life is a GHCAA program that educates local residents about how they can save on their energy costs and learn to live green - including having energy usage assessments done, gardening more, recycling items, and utilizing methods to lessen dependence on the electrical grid.

A big part of the Put a Little Green In Your Life program involves youth. GHCAA staff offer presentations at local schools, that show kids ways they can go green at home.

Fire Your Clothes Dryer is another aspect of our green initiatives. Each client participating in FYCD will receive 2 indoor drying racks if they rent their home OR one outdoor clothes line and one indoor drying rack if they own their home.

By not using an electric clothes dryer, we have calculated that a one person household will save \$96.00 annually, and a family of 4 is estimated to save \$576 per year! The life of the outdoor clothes lines and indoor drying racks is estimated to be 40 years. The estimated savings per family of 4 over the 40 year time frame is \$23,040!

Just think of what else your family could be spending that \$576 per year on!

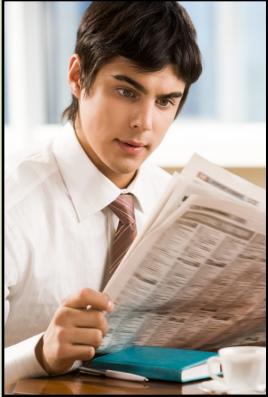

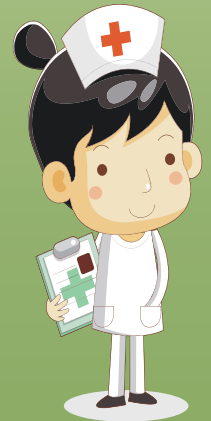

Offender Empowerment Program Seeks Mentors

The Green Hills Community Action Agency's highly successful Offender Empowerment Program (OEP) is seeking mentors and team members in Linn County. Since January of this year, the program has been meeting with clients in Harrison, Grundy, and Linn Counties. Since that time, the program has expanded to include Sullivan, Putnam, and Mercer Counties as well.

The focus of the Offender Empowerment Program is to help individuals recently released from the correctional system to successfully return to their communities through education, skill building, and obtaining gainful employment. Staff meets with clients as often as weekly, to as little as once a month, depending on the client's needs and employment status.

Community support and team development has led to the early success of the OEP and will be the basis for continuing that success. The program makes use of mentors who meet with and provide support to participants. Community worksites also play a vital part by helping those enrolled in the program gain a current work history. Another key element of the program includes skill building workshops, which clients are urged to participate in. A total of 46 workshops have already been conducted.

According to the Department of Corrections, it costs taxpayers an estimated \$25,000 per year to keep on e individual incarcerated. That same individual could earn \$15,000 per year if

they were employed at minimum wage - a positive gain of \$40,600 annually!

To date, the Offender Empowerment Program has helped 30 people gain full-time employment, and 14 people gain part-time employment.

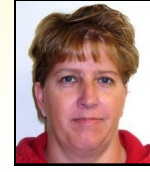
